June 9 – <u>Northeast Resource Recovery Association's 6th Annual School</u> <u>Recycling Conference</u> in Manchester, NH. This year's theme is "Real Challenges-Real Solutions". <u>Register</u>.

June 21-27 – <u>Student Climate & Conservation Congress (Sc3)</u>, U.S. Fish an Wildlife Service's National Conservation Training Center in Shepherdstown WV. The Sc3 Congress empowers student environmental leaders with the skills, knowledge, and tools necessary to address natural resource conservation challenges and better serve their schools and communities.
