The school year is moving along and it's time to participate in THE GREEN TEAM activities! This year's program is underway and we have some great plans ahead, but first let's recap some highlights from last year's program. Thanks to all the 2002-2003 GREEN TEAM participants!

We would first and foremost like to thank all the teachers, students and administrators who made last year's GREEN TEAM program a big success!. Two hundred and twenty four classes signed up for THE GREEN TEAM and received GREEN TEAM Kits. Forty-one classes sent in their "Teacher Response Forms" telling of the recycling activities they conducted. Each class that participated and submitted Teacher Response Forms received Certificates and prizes. Prizes included pencils, bookmarks and minirecycling bin planters, two tree plantings and eight assembly presentations from Jack Golden, Peter O'Malley, and EarthTunes.

Lots of Recycling in 2003!

A big congratulations to all of you! All 41 classes that returned Response Forms received Trash Terminator Certificates by taking THE GREEN TEAM pledge. Three classes achieved Conservation Coyote status, and thirty-five became Environmental Eagles by completing activities from each level. Two of our Conservation Coyote classes received tree plantings and one received an assembly presentation. All the Environmental Eagle classes were entered into the Grand Prize drawing, and of these, seven received assembly presentations and two received tree plantings. In addition, students from seventeen Environmental Eagle classes received mini-recycling bins with seed packs inside.

Outstanding Recycling Programs for 2003

Seven schools from the Environmental Eagle category received Grand Prizes. These included three recycling magic shows to all the 1st through 4th grade students at the Comprehensive Grammar School in Methuen for beginning a new school recycling



program, creating recycling signs and posters, setting up an outdoor composting bin, and reusing milk cartons and other materials to make bird feeders. The recycling magic shows were performed by Peter O'Malley, a magician from the Boston area who specializes in


educating youth about recycling through his entertaining shows. Thanks to Debbie Donovan-Perez, Jennifer Grasso, and Joanne Billings for their recycling leadership!

Grand Prizes were also awarded to the North Middle School in Westfield, the S. Christa MacAuliffe Elementary School in Lowell, and the Greenhalge School in Lowell. The North Middle School, led by Carol Mentos, started a new recycling program, set up an educational worm bin and held an environmental awareness poster contest. The S. Christa MacAuliffe Elementary School, thanks to Fran McDougall, started a new recycling program, held an environmental awareness poster contest, started a waste free lunch day program, and set up an educational worm composting bin. The Greenhalge School in Lowell was awarded a Grand Prize for creating a new recycling program, running a third grade environmental awareness poster contest, setting up a worm composting bin, and holding a recycling drive to increase awareness in the community. Thanks to the efforts of Anabel Milinazzo for coordinating these efforts. These schools received educational presentations by Jack Golden, nationally acclaimed creator of the show "Garbage is My Bag."

Recycling Equipment Distributed in 2003

A total of 807 set-out bins, 156 deskside boxes, 59 wheeled carts, 5 compost bins and 17 worm bins were distributed to schools in 2003. This equipment is being used to initiate or expand school recycling programs.
