The **High Plain Elementary School** in Andover has made the Green Team Spotlight for their new composting program! Parent volunteers have really helped with education and implementation both in the cafeteria and in the auditorium. Students were excited about the new program at a school-wide assembly that showed a "reader's theater" skit with characters such as the Lorax, Kermit the Frog, Oscar the Grouch, Cat in the Hat, all played by several students from the middle school. There was also a demonstration of how the new sorting works and a <a href="compilation video">compilation video</a> of students and volunteers taking part in the waste audit. The school expects to divert over 75% of waste from the cafeteria by composting and recycling!
