March 8th – <u>Massachusetts Agriculture in the Classroom</u> will hold their 13th Annual <u>Winter</u> <u>Growing Minds through Massachusetts Agriculture Conference</u>. There will be four workshop sessions, with eight concurrent workshops in each session related to agriculture in the classroom, including worm composting and anaerobic digestion!
